

Visiting Lecturer in Psychology

The Department of Psychology at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) invites applications for a **Visiting Lecturer position in PSYCHOLOGY** beginning January 2010. The area of specialization is open, and candidates are desired who could teach courses in Introductory Psychology. Importantly, we are looking for a Visiting Lecturer who will strive for excellence in teaching and will be involved in our undergraduate program. Candidates with a Ph.D. or who are ABD will be considered. Applications from women and from minority candidates are strongly encouraged.

The Psychology Department has 22 full-time faculty, 450 undergraduate majors, and approximately 60 graduate students enrolled in programs in Clinical Psychology (M.S. and Ph.D.) Industrial/Organizational (M.S.), and Psychobiology (Ph.D.).
